to what God is doing through Avail as we seek to bring glory to Him in all that we do.



The average team GPA was 3.661 at the time of submission.





HIGH SCHOOL GO PROJECTS 2021-2022

Covenant Living: Avail Academy 10th grade students have been studying poetry this semester. Some of the questions they explored included...Where does poetry come from? and What is poetry for? Our deep hope is that students begin to see the ways the gift of poetry gives us insights into God's world. About mid-way through the semester, a unique opportunity came up that helped students see and experience answers to these questions that they did not expect. During the GO Project on Thursday mornings, 10th grade students had been meeting with assisted living residents from Covenant Living in Golden Valley, and they decided to interview them. We wanted our students to get to know their partners better--to listen to them share stories about their lives, what was important to them, what growing up was like for them, what wisdom they had to share. We decided to use that information and write a poem as a way of honoring them and their story. So after drafting the poem and interviewing them for a second time, students framed their poems and gifted them to the residents. Students read the final poems to the residents on Thursday, May 19 and presented the framed poem to them as a gift. Covenant Living was joy-filled on the day we shared our poems, a reminder that our greatest joy is found when we use God's gifts to bless others. By Wendell Schaap





Hope for the Community: Students help feed Blaine residents and the surrounding community by assisting with food distribution every week; packing bags with food, loading the bags into cars, and bringing joy to both those receiving the food and the other community volunteers.



Arc's Value Village: Students helped sort donations, displayed the items on the sales floor, and assisted customers in locating items at the New Hope Arc's Value Village store. Each time they served, students would learn more about how their work helped raise dollars to fund programs to support people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.



Government Class: The 11th & 12th-Grade U.S. Government & Politics class engaged in a mock Constitutional Convention. Each of the students were assigned a historical delegate to represent at the convention. Students enjoyed getting to know the unique personalities of these historical figures! Every Friday the students enter the Convention session and debate various political issues. The students prepared speeches, asked questions, made proposals, and came to an eventual consensus through voting or committee work. At the end, the goal is to come to an agreement on a finished Constitution. Through this process, students were able to interact firsthand with the Constitution and learn many of the realities of politics.



Spring Musical: The high school welcomed over 450 audience members this spring as the cast and crew brought to the stage beautiful, energetic, and moving performances of '*Annie*'. COMMUNITY OUTREACH:


